Gift Aid declaration form

Gift Aid is a wonderful scheme which enables charities to claim back from HMRC the tax donors have paid on their donations.

Benefits for Watty Graham's GAC

- We can receive an extra 25p for every £1 you donate, and it doesn't cost us anything.
- If you have donated in the past four years, or will in the future, we can claim back the tax on that too.
- We can use this extra money to make your support worth more to everyone who benefits from our services, it all adds up.

Benefits for you

- You just need to make a declaration once, and we will be able to claim on all your donations.
- You know that we can do more with your gift at no extra cost to you.
- Higher rate taxpayers can claim further relief on their gifts via their self-assessment tax return. Please contact HMRC for more information on how to do this.

Please note you are only eligible for the scheme if you have paid enough UK income tax or capital gains tax to cover the tax claimed on all your charitable donations in each tax year.
